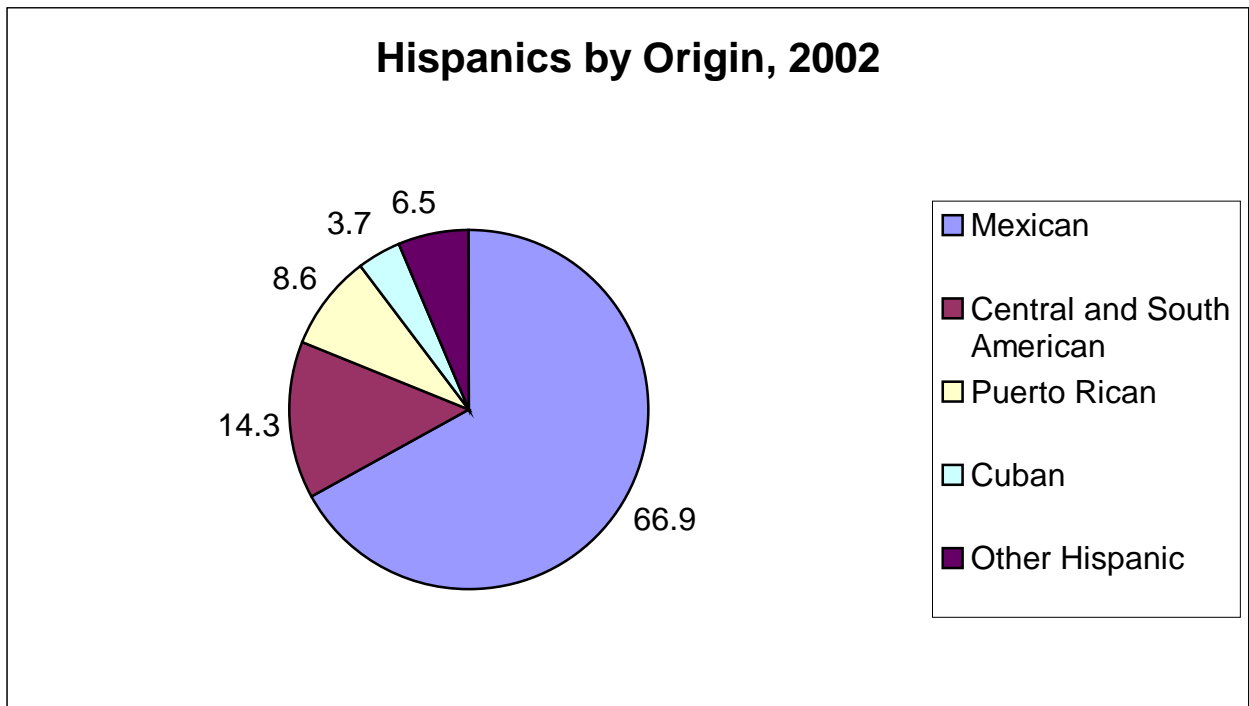


In March 2002, the U.S. Census reported that there were 37.4 million Hispanic/Latinos in the US.

Of the Hispanic population:

- ❑ 66.9% were Mexican
- ❑ 14.3 Central and South American
- ❑ 8.6% Puerto Rican
- ❑ 3.7% Cuban
- ❑ 6.5% from other Hispanic origins

Puerto Rico is not included in the population survey results.
